Parallel Lives Susumu Shingu + Renzo Piano


Nakanoshima Museum of Art, Osaka July 13 – September 14, 2023

This exhibition is a two-person exhibition by Susumu Shingu, an artist from Osaka, and Renzo Piano, an architect from Genoa. It is a one-of-a-kind collaboration between Japan and Italy's leading masters.

The two met on the occation of an international architectural competition at Kansai International Airport (1989-1994). Renzo Piano, who was chosen as the architect, asked Susumu Shingu, who was attracting attention as an "artist of the wind," to
«make it possible to see the flow of air.»

While the architecture of Piano is avant-garde, it is very gentle in removing the boundary between the inside and outside of the building and harmonizing it with the climate of the place. He had connected with Shingu, which has been creating works on the themes of wind, light, and water, through a cross-border affinity, and have taken this opportunity to complete more than ten projects that have been realized around the world in the more than 30 years to this day. And projects for the future are still underway. The exhibition will also introduce the future project of Shingu and Piano, who will also be 86 years old on the first and last day of the exhibition.

The title "Parallel Lives" comes from the title of a biography by the Greek philosopher Plutarch of the 1st and 2nd centuries comparing two great people who had many common personalities and lives. Studio Azzurro, an Italian avant-garde group active in the field of video art, will join us with videos based on their sketches, blueprints and photographs, expressing on a grand scale the trajectory of their sparkling intersection with their creative worlds full of dreams and adventures.

- 1987 Holds outdoor exhibition *Windcircus* that tours the world.
- 1992 Completes *Columbus's Wind* in Genoa harbor in Italy.
- 1994 Completes *Boundless Sky* in passenger terminal of Kansai International Airport in Osaka, Japan.
- 2000 2001 *Wind Caravan* exhibition tours six locations throughout the world.
- 2001 Completes *Hommage au Cosmos* at Ginza Maison Hermès in Tokyo, Japan.
- 2014 Susumu Shingu Wind Museum opens in Hyogo Prefecture, Japan.
- 2016 2017 Holds traveling solo exhibition SPACESHIP—Susumu Shingu at Nagasaki Prefectural Art Museum, Yokosuka Museum of Art, and Hyogo Prefectural Museum of Art.

Highlights: Parallel Lives—Susumu Shingu + Renzo Piano, Jul 13 - Sep 14, 2023 at Nakanoshima Museum of Art, Osaka

Parallel Lives timeline looks back on collaborations between two great creative masters, Susumu Shingu and Renzo Piano

These two artists, both born in 1937, have created famous works of art and architecture throughout the world. Looking back on their creative careers through photographs and other materials, the *Parallel Lives* timeline traces their achievements from the origins of their practices until the present day.

Presenting seven collaborations by Shingu and Piano, including the Kansai International Airport Passenger Terminal Building, through valuable models and materials, and dynamic video

Starting with their first collaboration, the Kansai International Airport Passenger Terminal Building, they have completed ten projects together throughout the world over the course of more than three decades, as well as many unbuilt projects. Studio Azzurro, an Italian group that has garnered attention as a pioneer in the field of video for its minutely crafted models and prototypes as well as its works that are multifaceted and interactive, has created a distinctive video that highlights seven collaborations, providing a collage of sketches, designs, and photos by Shingu and Piano, and presents it with detailed commentary, projecting it on a massive backdrop.

Exhibiting iconic sculptures by Susumu Shingu, from his early days until the present

Susumu Shingu is an international artist known for works with themes of wind, light, and water that move using natural energy. The exhibition includes iconic works that symbolize his reputation as a "sculptor of the wind," such as *Wings of Freedom, Moon Boat NY*, and *Echo of Sky*.

Presenting famous works by Renzo Piano, including historical masterpieces, through valuable models and materials and dynamic videos

Renzo Piano has captivated the world with plans and designs that are avant-garde, but also eliminate boundaries between inside and outside and prioritize harmony with the natural environment of the location. His many innovative architectural masterpieces, such as the Centre Georges Pompidou, IBM Travelling Pavilion, and Jean-Marie Tjibaou Cultural Center, are presented in detail using valuable models and other materials as well as videos by Studio Azzurro.

The latest projects are actually taking place now in Japan! Details of future projects are revealed that can only be seen here.

The exhibition begins and ends on the duo's birthdays—Susumu Shingu's birthday is on July 13 and Renzo Piano's falls on September 14. The latest projects are actually taking place in Japan now. Enjoy seeing what lies in store for the duo's creative world of dreams and adventure.
